Grade: Third through Fifth

Subject: Language Arts

Objective: Recognize agricultural terms.

Standard: Determine type of poetry based on genre characteristics/features.

Procedure: Write your full first name vertically on a piece of paper. Then, write an agriculture word/term that starts with each letter in your name.

Additional Activities: Have students write other poetry styles, such as Cinquain Poetry (see attached outline) using agricultural terms (Language Arts).

Cinquain Poetry

Writing a form of poetry called cinquains is a very descriptive way to express the nature and beauty of agriculture. Think about what you have read, seen or heard about raising poultry. Use a cinquain outline to help you express what you know in poetry.

To write a cinquain poem, you will need to use many adjectives or describing words. First, choose one word to give your poem a title. This will also be the first line of your poem.

Now brainstorm as many words you can to describe a chicken, duck, a turkey, an egg, etc.
