

#### **Summary of Trade Relationship:**

South Korea, although export focused in non-agricultural goods, has a mountainous landscape that can support a small amount of arable land and must import large amounts of food. South Korea has a prosperous population of 51 million that demands increasingly greater food varieties at lower prices and greater convenience. For agricultural trade South Korea is in the top ten destinations for U.S. Ag-trade. In recent years, beef has become the most valuable U.S. ag-export to South Korea. Australia is a major contender in the South Korean beef market, in the past when food borne illness issues shave struck Australia has taken much of the U.S. market share.

Based on Iowa's share of U.S. production and exportation to South Korea, corn is a \$200 million market, pork follows closely behind at \$126 million. Iowa benefits greatly from trade with South Korea.

The Korea-U.S. Free Trade Agreement was implemented March 15, 2012. This is being targeted for potential renegotiation as of September 2017. However, the U.S. runs a large agricultural trade surplus with South Korea.
