The institute is open to individuals of all ages. Each county may nominate one Farm Bureau member to apply. Each year, 25–30 participants are selected, including one leader from each region and several at-large participants.

INVESTMENT TO PARTICIPATE

The program is valued at \$6,000 per participant.

- The Iowa Farm Bureau Federation covers most costs, including hotel, meals, and D.C. travel expenses.
- The County Farm Bureau will make an investment of \$200.
- Participants are responsible for transportation to/from Des Moines.

Applications are due December 5, 2025.

To apply, you must have the support of your county Farm Bureau president. Applicants will be notified of selection committee decisions by December 31.
